

Veteran Directed Care

A Veterans Affairs funded Program at the Center for Living Independently in the CNMI

The Veteran Directed Care (VDC) program is a partnership between the Department of Veterans Affairs (Veterans Health Administration) and the Center for Living Independently in the CNMI (CLI-CNMI).

The VDC program allows eligible veterans of any age the opportunity to receive personal care services in their homes. Family or friends can be paid to provide that care if a Veteran chooses. CLI-CNMI staff work with eligible Veterans to manage their monthly budget to purchase goods and services such as:

- In-home personal care
- Homemaker services
- Caregiver support
- Transportation reimbursement

- Assistive devices
- Meal delivery
- Laundry services
